AIREDALE SQUARE BREAD PUDDING
From the Kitchen of Anne Benenson
10.11.08

Preheat Oven to 350°

Ingredients:

1 1-LB. Loaf of Pepperidge Farm White Bread (cut into 1inch cubes, leaving crust on)
8 Large Eggs
2 Cups (1 Pint) of Whole Milk (note: do not use skim or non-fat)
2 Cups (1 Pint) of Heavy Cream (note: do not substitute half and half)
1 Cup of Granulated Sugar
1 teaspoon Vanilla
½ teaspoon Almond Extract
1 Tablespoon Cinnamon
Pinch of Kosher Salt
¾ Cup of Raisins

Directions:

Spread cubed bread out on a tray a day or two ahead of time to stale the bread in the open air.

In a very large bowl whisk the eggs. Add milk, cream, sugar, vanilla and almond extracts, cinnamon and salt. Continue to whisk by hand until just combined.

Place cubed bread and raisins in the custard and let soak until the custard is almost completely absorbed by the bread-about an hour. Gently press bread occasionally with a wooden spoon to submerge any pieces of bread sticking out of the custard.

Butter a large round glass casserole dish or two 2- 9" x 2" deep metal baking pans. Bake at 350° for ½ an hour to 1 hour or just until custard is set, do not over bake or it will harden the bread pudding. If a paring knife comes out barely clean and pudding no longer jiggles...it's done!
